


OLD ECOLOGICAL BURDENS IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

- Beginning of remediation activities: 1991
- Source of funding so called Privatization Fund


- Government Regulation 51/2001 and Directive of MoE 3/2004
- Polluter pays principles
- Czech Environmental Inspectorate
- 2012 2014: no new contracts -> updating the ongoing projects, completion of remediation activities: depending on available financial sources
- priorities for 2015: 20 locations (cooperation of MoE, MoF and Czech Environmental Inspectorate)

Operational environmental program

2007 - 2013

Total costs: 8.4 billion CZK 7 billion CZK from Cohesion fund

2014 - 2020

Estimated costs: 3.16 billion CZK

National environmental program

- Notice to remove and cultivate illegal dumping, old ecological damages, where local authorities have used all possible means
- 100 million CZK




New programming period - Support area 3.4 Complete inventory and eliminate the environmental burden

- 115 468 727 €= 3 163 843 120 CZK
 - 3.4.1. Inventory
 300 105 000 Kč
 - 3.4.2. Survey works and risk analysis

450 157 500 Kč

3.4.3. Remediation works
 2 413 580 620 Kč





Remediation of former Soviet Army military bases in CR





- 115 contaminated sites (mainly petroleum and chlorinated hydrocarbons)
 - area Milovice, Ralsko, Hradčany airport
- Total remediation costs: approx. 53 million EUR
- Beginning of remediation activities: 1991
- Completion of remediation activities: 2016



Revitalization and restoration of sites damaged by mining of minerals and oil

- Damages from the past Governmental Resolution from 2002
- 3 areas, 6 commissions
- Ministry of the Environment as specialized adviser

Ústecký and Karlovarský region	15 billion CZK
Moravskoslezský region and South Morava	21 billion CZK
Kladenský region	1.7 billion CZK



Supported actions

- Revitalization of forests and agricultural sites
- Revitalization of bodies of water and bio corridors
- Cultivation of sites for settlement and leisure time
- Cultivation of building sites and infrastructure

Other agenda

- Methodology: Pollution indicators, Risk analysis, Feasibility study, Samples etc.
- Basic principles:
 - Socially acceptable level of environmental and health risks
 - Future use of the territory (suitable for use)
 - Continuous proces, evaluation of contamination data, potential re-assessment of remediation goals after completion of the first phase of remediation measures (Updated Risk Assessment)
- Evidence of contaminated locations SEKM/NIKM, prioritizing
- Ecological damage prevention law
